ENFORCEMENT OF RESTRICTIONS ON COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES LEVEL 4
AND LEVEL 3 *CORONA VIRUS DISEASE* 2019
IN JAVA AND BALI

MINISTER OF INTERIOR,

Following the direction of the President of the Republic of Indonesia to implement the Implementation of Restrictions on Community Activities (PPKM) Level 4 (four) and Level 3 (three) *Corona Virus Disease* (COVID-19) in Java and Bali in accordance with the criteria of pandemic situation level based on assessment and to complete implementation of the Instruction of the Minister of Home Affairs on Restriction of Community Activities Based on Level 3 (three), Level 2 (two) and Level 1 (one) and optimizing the Post handling of COVID-19 at the Village and Kelurahan level to Control the Spread of COVID-19, instructed:

to : 1. Governor; and
2. Regent/Mayor,

to :

first : Special To:

- a. Governor of DKI Jakarta for districts / cities with criteria Level 4 (four) namely Thousand Islands Administration District, West Jakarta Administrative City, East Jakarta Administrative City, South Jakarta Administrative City, North Jakarta Administrative City and Central Jakarta Administrative City,
- b. Governor of Banten and Regent/Mayor for District/City with the following criteria:
 - 1) level 3 (three) namely Serang Regency, Lebak Regency, Pandeglang Regency; and
 - 2) Level 4 (four) namely South Tangerang City, Kota Tangerang, Serang City, Tangerang Regency and Cilegon City,
- c. Governor of West Java and Regent/Mayor for District/City with the following criteria:
 - 1) level 3 (three) namely Sukabumi Regency, Subang Regency, Pangandaran Regency,

- Majalengka Regency, Kuningan Regency, Indramayu Regency, Garut Regency, Cirebon Regency, Cianjur Regency, Ciamis Regency, Tasikmalaya Regency; and
- 2) Level 4 (four) namely Purwakarta Regency, Karawang Regency, Bekasi Regency, Sukabumi City, Depok City, Cirebon City, Cimahi City, Bogor City, Bekasi City, Banjar City, Bandung City and Tasikmalaya City, Sumedang Regency, Bogor Regency, West Bandung Regency and Bandung Regency,
- d. Governor of Central Java and Regent /Mayor for wilayah Regency / City with the criteria:
- 1) level 3 (three) namely Purbalingga Regency, Pekalongan Regency, Magelang Regency, Cilacap Regency, Brebes Regency, Boyolali Regency, Blora Regency, Pemalang Regency, Grobogan Regency; and
 - 2) Level 4 (four) namely Jepara Regency, Sukoharjo Regency, Rembang Regency, Pati Regency, Kudus Regency, Klaten Regency, Kebumen Regency, Banyumas Regency, Tegal City, Surakarta City, Semarang City, Salatiga City, Magelang City, Wonosobo Regency, Wonogiri Regency, Temanggung Regency, Tegal Regency, Sragen Regency, Semarang Regency, Purworejo Regency, Kendal Regency, Karanganyar Regency, Demak Regency, Batang Regency, Banjarnegara Regency and Pekalongan City,
- e. Governor of Daerah Istimewa Yogyakarta and Regent/Mayor for District/City with Level 4 (four) (four) criteria: Sleman Regency, Bantul Regency and Yogyakarta City, Kulonprogo Regency and Gunungkidul Regency,
- f. Governor of East Java and Regent/Mayor for District / City with the criteria:
- 1) level 3 (three) namely Sampang Regency, Pasuruan Regency, Pamekasan Regency, Pacitan Regency, Kediri Regency, Sumenep Regency, Probolinggo Regency; and
 - 2) Level 4 (four) namely Tulungagung Regency, Sidoarjo Regency, Madiun Regency, Lamongan Regency,

- Gresik Regency, Surabaya City, Mojokerto City, Malang City, Madiun City, Kediri City, Blitar City, Batu City, Tuban Regency, Trenggalek Regency, Ponorogo Regency, Ngawi Regency, Nganjuk Regency, Mojokerto Regency, Malang Regency, Ten Magetan Regency, Lumajang Regency, Jombang Regency, Jember Regency, Bondowoso Regency, Bojonegoro Regency, Blitar Regency, Banyuwangi Regency, Bangkalan Regency, Probolinggo City, Pasuruan City and Situbondo Regency,
- g. Governor of Bali and Regent /Mayor for the Regency / City with the criteria:
- 1) level 3 (three) namely Jembrana Regency, Bangli Regency, Karangasem Regency; and
 - 2) Level 4 (four) are Badung Regency, Gianyar Regency, Klungkung Regency, Tabanan Regency, Buleleng Regency and Denpasar City.

second : The determination of the regional level as referred to in the Kesatu Dictum is guided by the Indicators of Adjustment of Efforts to Community Health and Social Restrictions in The Response to the COVID-19 Pandemic set by the Minister of Health. Adjustments are made to agglomeration areas in Jabodetabek, Bandung Raya, Semarang Raya, Solo Raya, Special Region of Yogyakarta, Surabaya Raya and Malang Raya, where if the majority of cities / districts in 1 (one) agglomeration area is still at Level 4 (four), then other district cities within the agglomeration area is not in Level 4 (four) then it will be level 4 (four).

third : PPKM in Districts and Cities in Java and Bali with Level 4 (four) criteria as referred to in kesatu dictum is carried out by implementing the following activities:

- a. implementation of teaching and learning activities (Schools, Colleges, Academies, Places of Education / Training conducted online /online;
- b. implementation of activities in the non-essential sector is enforced 100% (one hundred percent) *Work From Home* (WFH);
- c. implementation of activities in the sector:
 - 1) essentials such as
 - a) financial and banking only include insurance, banks, pawnshops, futures exchanges, pension funds, and financing (oriented towards

- physical service with customers (*customer*));
 - b) capital market (which is oriented to service with customers (*customers*) and the running of capital market operations well);
 - c) information and communication technology including mobile operators, data centers, internet, postal, media related to the dissemination of informants to the public;
 - d) hospitality non quarantine handling; and
 - e) export orientation industry and its support where the company must show evidence of examples of Goods Export Notification (PEB) documents during the last 12 (twelve) months or 1a in documents that indicate export plans and must have an Operational Permit and Mobility of Industrial Activities (IOMKI),
may operate under the following conditions:
 - a) for letter a) can operate with a maximum capacity of 50% (fifty percent) of staff for locations related to service to the community, as well as 25% (twenty-five percent) for office administration services to support operations;
 - b) for letter b) up to letter d) can operate with a maximum capacity of 50% (fifty percent) staff; and
 - c) for letter e) can only operate 1 (one) shift with a maximum capacity of 50% (fifty percent) staff only in production facilities / factories, and 10% (ten percent) for office administration services to support operations,
- 2) essential to a government that provides public services that cannot be delayed in implementation of a maximum of 25% (twenty-five percent) of WFO staff with strict health protocols;
- 3) critical such as:
- a) health;
 - b) security and order;
 - c) handling bencana;
 - d) energy;
 - e) logistics, transportation and distribution especially for the basic needs of the community;
 - f) food and beverages and support, including for livestock/pets;
 - g) fertilizers and petrochemicals;
 - h) cement and building materials;

- i) national vital objects;
- j) national strategic projects;
- k) construction (public infrastructure);
- l) utilities (electricity, water and waste management),
may operate under the following conditions:
 - a) for letter a) and letter b) can operate 100% (one hundred percent) staff without any engecualian; and
 - b) for letter c) up to letter l) can operate 100% (one hundred percent) maximum staff, only in production facilities / construction / service tothe community and for officeadministration services to support operations, diberdo a maximum of 25% (twenty-five percent) percent maximum WFO staff,
- 4) for supermarkets, people's markets, grocery stores and supermarkets that sell daily necessities are limited to 20:00 local time with a visitor capacity of 50% (fifty percent); and
- 5) for pharmacies and drugstores can be open for 24 (twenty-four) hours,
- d. People's markets that sell non-daily necessities can operate with a maximum capacity of 50% (fifty percent) and operating hours until 15:00 local time;
- e. street vendors, grocery stores, agents /*outletvouchers*, *barbershops* /barbershops, *laundry*, hawkers, small workshops, vehicle laundry, and others of the like are allowed to open with strict Health protocols until 20:00 local time and technical arrangements are carried out by theRegional Government;
- f. implementation of eating / drinking activities in public places:
 - 1) food stalls / warteg, street vendors, hawker stalls and the like are allowed to open with strict health protocols until 20.00 local time with a maximum of100 g eaters in place
3 (three) persons and maximum meal time
20 (twenty) minutes. The next technical arrangement is regulated by the Local Government;
 - 2) restaurants / restaurants, cafes with a location that is in a building / closed shop both in its own placeand located in a shopping center / mall only accept delivery / take *away* and do not accept meals in place (*dine-in*);
- g. activities in shopping centers / malls / trade centers are temporarily closed except access for store employees who serve sales

- online with a maximum of 3 (three) persons per store, restaurant, supermarket, and supermarket may be allowed with due regard to the provisions on the THIRD dictum points c.4 and f.2;
- h. implementation of construction activities for public infrastructure (construction sites and project sites) operates 100% (one hundred percent) by implementing stricter health protocols;
 - i. places of worship (Mosques, Mosques, Churches, Temples, Viharas, and Temples and other places that function as places of worship), do not act as worship / religious activities during the implementation of PPKM and optimize the implementation of worship at home;
 - j. public facilities (public areas, public parks, public attractions and other public areas) are temporarily closed;
 - k. arts, cultural, sports and social activities (art locations, culture, sports facilities and social activities that can cause crowds and crowds) are temporarily closed;
 - l. public transportation (public transportation, mass transportation, taxis (conventional and *online*) and rental vehicles) are enforced with a maximum capacity setting of 50% (fifty percent) by implementing stricter health protocols;
 - m. the implementation of the wedding reception was abolished during the implementation of PPKM Level 4 (four);
 - n. domestic travelers using private cars, motorcycles and long-distance public transport (airplanes, buses, ships and trains) must:
 - 1) show the vaccine card (minimum vaccination of the first dose);
 - 2) shows PCR H-2 for airborne aircraft serta Antigen (H-1) for private car, motorcycle, bus, rail and marine modes of transportation;
 - 3) the provisions as referred to in numbers 1) and number 2) only apply to arrivals and departures to and from Java and Bali and do not apply to transportation in the agglomeration area as an example for the Greater Jakarta area;
 - 4) for drivers of logistics vehicles and other transport of goods are excluded from the provision of having a vaccine card.
 - o. still wear the mask correctly and consistently when carrying out activities outside the home and not allowed to use *face shields* without using the mask; and
 - p. implementation of PPKM at the RT / RW, Village / Village and Sub-District levels remains enforced by activating posts at each level by looking at the zoning criteria of regional control.

fourth

: PPKM in District and City in Java and Bali with Level 3 (three) criteria as referred to in the first dictum is carried out by applying the following activities:

- a. implementation of teaching and learning activities (Schools, Colleges, Academies, Places of Education / Training conducted online */online*);
- b. implementation of activities in the non-essential sector is enforced 100% (one hundred percent) *Work From Home* (WFH);
- c. implementation of activities in the sector:

1) essentials such as

- a) finance and banking only include insurance, banks, pawnshops, futures exchanges, pension funds, and financing institutions (which are oriented towards physical services with customers (*customers*));
- b) capital market (oriented pada service with customers (*customers*) and the running of capital market operations well);
- c) information and communication technology including mobile operators, data centers, internet, postal, media related to the dissemination of information to the public;
- d) hospitality non quarantine handling; and
- e) export orientation industry and its supporting parties where the company must show evidence of examples of Goods Export Notification (PEB) documents during the last 12 (twelve) months or other documents that indicate export plans and must have an Operational Permit and Mobility of Industrial Activities (IOMKI),

may operate under the following conditions:

- a) for letter a) can operate with a maximum capacity of 50% (fifty percent) staff for locations related to services to the community, as well as 25% (twenty-five percent) for office administration services to support operations;
- b) for letter b) up to letter d) can operate with a maximum capacity of 50% (fifty percent) staff; and

- c) for letter e) can only operate with a setting of 2 (two) shifts with a maximum capacity of 50% (fifty percent) staff for each shift only in production facilities / factories, and 10% (ten percent) for office administration services to support operations, by applying health protocols, arrangements to enter and return and eat employees are not simultaneously.
- 2) essential in the government sector that provides public services that cannot be delayed implementation is enforced 25% (twenty-five percent) maximum WFO staff with strict health protocols;
- 3) critical such as:
 - a) health;
 - b) security and order;
 - c) disaster management;
 - d) energy;
 - e) logistics, transportation and distribution especially for the basic needs of the community;
 - f) food and beverages and support, including for livestock/pets;
 - g) fertilizers and petrochemicals;
 - h) cement and building materials;
 - i) national vital objects;
 - j) national strategic projects;
 - k) construction (public infrastructure);
 - l) utilities (electricity, water and waste management), may operate under the following conditions:
 - a) for letter a) and letter b) can operate 100% (one hundred percent) staff without exception; and
 - b) for letter c) up to letter l) can operate 100% (one hundred percent) maximum staff, only in production facilities / construction / service to the community and for office administration services to support operations, enforced a maximum of 25% (twenty-five percent) percent of staff,
- 4) for supermarkets, people's markets, grocery stores and supermarkets that sell daily necessities are limited to 20:00 local time with a visitor capacity of 50% (fifty percent); and

- 5) for pharmacies and drugstores can be open for 24 (twenty-four) hours,
- d. The people's market that sells non-daily necessities can operate with a maximum capacity of 50% (fifty percent) and operating hours until 15:00 local time:
- e. street vendors, grocery stores, agents /outlet vouchers, barbershops /barbershops, laundry, hawkers, small workshops, laundry, and others of the same kind are allowed to open by implementing strict health protocols until 20:00 local time and technical arrangements are carried out by the Local Government;
- f. implementation of eating / drinking activities in public places:
 - 1) food stalls / warteg, street vendors, hawker stalls and the like are allowed to open with strict health protocols until 20.00 local time with a maximum of 25% (two puluh five percent) of capacity and a maximum meal time of 30 (thirty) minutes. The next technical arrangement is regulated by the Local Government; and
 - 2) restaurants / restaurants, cafes with a location that is in the building / closed shop both in its own location and located in the shopping center / mall only accept delivery / take away and do not accept meals in place (*dine-in*);
- g. activities in shopping centers / malls / trade centers are opened with a maximum capacity of 25% (twenty-five percent) until 17:00 local time with regard to the provisions in c.4 and f.2;
- h. the implementation of construction activities for public tour infrastructure (construction sites and project sites) operates 100% (one hundred percent) and small-scale construction is allowed a maximum of 10 (ten) people by applying health protocols more strictly;
- i. places of worship (Mosques, Mosques, Churches, Temples, Vihara, and Temples and other places that function as places of worship), can hold worship / religious activities during the implementation of PPKM Level 3 (three) with a maximum of 25% (twenty-five percent) capacity or 20 (twenty people) people by applying health protocols

- more strictly;
- j. public facilities (public areas, public parks, public attractions and other public areas) are temporarily closed;
 - k. arts, cultural, sports and social activities (art locations, culture, sports facilities and social activities that can cause crowds and crowds) are temporarily closed;
 - l. public transportation (public transportation, mass transportation, taxis (conventional and *online*) and rental vehicles) are enforced with a maximum capacity setting of 70% (seventy percent) by applying health protocols more strictly;
 - m. the implementation of wedding reception can be held with a maximum of 20 (twenty) invitations and do not hold meals in place by applying health protocols more strictly;
 - n. domestic travelers using private cars, motorcycles and long-distance public transport (airplanes, buses, ships and trains) must:
 - 1) show the vaccine card (minimum vaccination of the first dose);
 - 2) shows PCR H-2 for udara aircraft as well as Antigen (H-1) for private car, motorcycle, bus, train and marine modes of transportation;
 - 3) provisions as referred to in numbers 1) and number 2) only apply to arrivals and departures to and from Java and Bali and do not apply to transportation within the agglomeration area as an example for the Greater Jakarta area;
 - 4) for drivers of logistics vehicles and other transport of goods are excluded from the provision of having a vaccine card.
 - o. still wear the mask properly and consistently when carrying out activities outside the home and not allowed to use face *shield* without the use of masks; and
 - p. implementation of PPKM at the RT/RW level, villages/villages and sub-districts remains enforced by activating posts at each level by looking at the criteria zoning control.

fifth

: The Governor is authorized to divert the allocation of vaccine needs from districts and cities

- vaccine allocation to districts and cities that lack vaccine allocation.
- sixth : Governors, Regents and Mayors prohibit any forms of activity/activity that may cause crowds.
- seventh : Governors, Regents and Mayors coordinate and collaborated with the TNI, Police and Prosecutors in the implementation of PPKM.
- eighth : Carrying out the tightening of activities and education with the following principles:
- a. COVID-19 is most contagious in closed conditions, long meeting meetings (more than 15 menit), close interactions, crowds, activities with strong breathing such as singing, talking and laughing and not wearing masks as when eating together;
 - b. proper and consistent use of masks is the minimum health protocol that everyone should implement;
 - c. washing hands with soap or *hand sanitizer* repeatedly especially after touching objects touched by others (such as door gagor ladder handles), touching the face area by hand should be avoided;
 - d. better type of mask, will better protect (for example disposable surgical mask is better than cloth mask, and N95 mask is better than surgical mask). Currently, the use of masks as many as 2 (two) layers is a good choice. Masks should be replaced after use (>4 (more than four) hours);
 - e. the application of health protocols is carried out taking into account the factors of air ventilation, duration, and distance of interaction, to minimize the risk of transmission in activities;
 - f. distance considerations can be applied as follows:
 - 1) activities from home only, and interact only with people who live in the house;
 - 2) if you have to leave the house, then you should always try to get at least 2 (two) meters in interacting with others. Reduce/avoid contact with others who do not live in the house; and
 - 3) socialize the various visual cues in the public places related to the prevention and handling of COVID-19,

- g. duration considerations can be applied as follows:
 - 1) if it is to interact with others or attend an activity, it is carried out for a short duration to reduce the risk of transmission; and
 - 2) in offices and other activity situations, scheduling and rotation can help to reduce the duration of interactions,
- h. Ventilation considerations can be applied as follows:
 - 1) outdoor activities have a much lower risk of transmission than indoors; and
 - 2) the room should always be attempted to have air ventilation that baik. Opening the door, a window can be done to reduce the risk of transmission. In the condition that the door or window cannot be opened, then the *air purifier* with *High Efficiency Particulate Air* (HEPA) filter can be used indoors,
- i. in conditions of penularan already widespread in the community, then stricter interventions by limiting the mobility of the community significantly need to be done;
- j. strengthening 3T (*testing, tracing, treatment*) needs to be continuously applied:
 - 1) *testing* needs to be improved in accordance with the weekly *positivity rate*, with the following conditions:

<i>Positivity rate</i> Downloads	Number of tests (per 1000 population per week)
<5%	1
>5%-<15%	5
>15%-<25%	10

Testing needs to be continuously improved with a target *positivity rate* of <10% (ten percent); *testing* needs to be continuously improved against suspek, i.e. those with symptoms, as well as close contact. The target people tested per day for each district follows the table as follows:

2) *tracing* needs to be done until it reaches more than 15 close contacts per confirmation case. Quarantine needs to be carried out on those identified as close contacts. Once identified close contact should be checked immediately (*entry-test*) and quarantine needs to be carried out. If the test results are positive, isolation is necessary. If the test result is negative then it is necessary to continue quarantine. On the 5th day of quarantine, it is necessary to *re-check (exit-test)* to see if the virus is detected after /during the incubation period. If it is negative, then the patient is considered to have finished quarantine; and

3) *treatment* needs to be done comprehensively according to the severity of the symptoms. Only moderate, severe, and critically symptomatic patients need to be hospitalized. Isolation needs to be done with strict to prevent transmission,

k. efforts to accelerate vaccination must continue to protect as many people as possible and these efforts are made to reduce the rate of transmission and put the safety of those who are vulnerable to death (such as lansia, people with comorbid) given the limited health capacity and long-term impact of COVID-19 infection.

NINTH:

Governors, Regents and Mayors to:

a. accelerate the process of distributing social assistance as well as social safety net sourced from APBD, if there is an additional need for funding for budgeting and distribution of social assistance and social safety net in supporting the implementation of PKM P, then:

- 1) rationalization and/or budget reallocation of less priority programs/activities in the social assistance budget and social safety net;
- 2) rationalization and/or reallocation procedures for additional funding needs for budgeting and distribution of aid

social /social safety net in supporting the implementation of PPKM guided by Article 4 and Article 5 of Regulation of the Minister of Home Affairs No. 20 of 2020 concerning The Acceleration of Corona *Virus Disease* 2019InThe Environment of Local Government and Article 3 to Article 6 of Regulation of the Minister of Home Affairs No. 39 of 2020 concerning The Prioritization of The Use of Budget Allocation for Certain Activities, Changes in Allocation and Use of Budget Revenue and Expenditure Daerah;

3) to accelerate the distribution and implementation of BLT-Dana Desa (BLT-DD):

a) Regent / Mayor to accelerate the evaluation of village budgets for villages that have not set village regulations on village budgets, ratification of KPM data by the Local government, recording of KPM data of BLT-DD recipients on Om-SPAN in accordance with the provisions of the legislation; and

b) Head of Village to record and determine the KPM, and follow up with the implementation of BLT-DD in accordance with the provisions of the laws and regulations,

b. synchronize social assistance coming from the center with social assistance sourced from apbd.

tenth

: Funding for the Implementation of PPKM due to the COVID-19 Pandemic sourced from apbd:

a. in the implementation of PPKM due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, the Local Government can make expenditures that are not yet available in the budget, which is further proposed in the draft budget changes;

b. expenditure as referred to in letter a is done by charging directly on Unexpected Expenditure (BTT);

c. in the event that the BTT is insufficient, the Local Government reschedules the achievements of programs and activities for the mainstreaming of the use of budget allocations for certain activities and/or changes in budget allocation and utilizes the cash available through changes in the regulation of the regional head of the Budget, and informs the leadership of the Regional People's Representative Council. The results of budget allocation rescheduling the achievements of the program and activities in question are transferred to belanja unexpected; and

- d. procedures for the use of BTT in the framework of the implementation of PPKM due to the COVID-19 Pandemic sourced from apbd guided by Regulation of the Minister of Home Affairs No. 39 It's 2020.
- Eleventh : a. In the event that the Governor, Regent and Mayor do not implement the provisions as referred to in this Ministerial Instruction, sanctions shall be imposed as stipulated in Article 68 to Article 78 of Law No. 23 of 2014 concerning Local Government;
- b. For Businesses, Restaurants, Shopping Centers, Public Transportation as referred to in the THIRD Dictum letter c, letter d, letter e, and letter j that do not implement the provisions as stipulated in this Instruction shall be subject to administrative sanctions sa mpai with the closure of business in accordance with the provisions of the laws and regulations; and
- c. Everyone may be penalized for violations in order to control infectious disease outbreaks based on:
- 1) Criminal Code Article 212 sampai with Article 218;
 - 2) Law No. 4 of 1984 on Infectious Disease Outbreaks;
 - 3) Law No. 6 of 2018 on Health Quarantine; and
 - 4) Regional Regulations, Regional Head Regulations; and
 - 5) Provisions of other relevant laws and regulations.
- Twelve : For districts and cities that are not included as referred to in the Kesatu Dictum, the Minister of Home Affairs still applies the Instruction of the Minister of Home Affairs which stipulates PPKM Level 2 (two) and Level 1 (one) serta Optimizing COVID-19 Handling Post at the Village and Village Level to Control the Spread of COVID-19 19 with regard to coverage of the region.
- THIRTEENTH : Things that have not been stipulated in this Ministerial Instruction, as long as related to PPKM Level 2 (two) and Level 1 (one) remain guided by the Instruction of the Minister of Home Affairs on Restrictions on Community Activities Level 2 (two) and Level 1 (one) and Optimizethe Post handling of COVID-19 at the Village and Village Level for Control of SPREAD OF COVID-19.

Fourteenth : This Ministerial Instruction shall come into force on
26 July 2021 to 2 August 2021.
