RESTRICTIONS ON COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES

LEVEL 4, LEVEL 3, LEVEL 2, AND LEVEL 1 *CORONA VIRUS DISEASE* 2019 IN JAWA AND BALI

MINISTER OF HOME AFFAIRS,

Following up on the direction of the President of the Republic of Indonesia who instructed to implement the Implementation of Restrictions on Community Activities (PPKM) Level 4 (four), Level 3 (three), Level 2 (two), and Level 1 (one) *Corona Virus Disease* 2019 (COVID-19) in Java and Bali in accordance with the criteria of the pandemic situation level based on assessment and to complete the implementation of PPKM that optimizes COVID-19 Handling Post at the Village and Village Level in the framework of Pe COVID-19, regarding the n it is instructed:

To : 1. Governor; and
2. Regent/Mayor,

To :

FIRST : Specifically to:

- a. Governor of DKI Jakarta for regency / city with criteria level 3 (three) namely Thousand Islands Administrative Regency, West Jakarta Administrative City, East Jakarta Administrative City, South Jakarta Administrative City, Jakarta Utara Administrative City and Central Jakarta Administrative City;
- a. Governor of Banten and Regent / Mayor for regency / city with criteria level 3 (three) namely Tangerang City, Cilegon City, Tangerang Regency, Serang Regency, Pandeglang Regency, Lebak Regency, South Tangerang City, and Serang City,
- b. Governor of West Java and Regent / Mayor for regency / city with criteria:
 - 1) level 2 (two) is Cirebon city, Pangandaran regency, Banjar city; and
 - 2) level 3 (three) is Kuningan Regency, Sukabumi City, Bogor City, Bekasi City, Kota Bandung, Tasikmalaya Regency, Sukabumi Regency, Purwakarta Regency, Majalengka Regency, Tasikmalaya City, Depok City, Cimahi City, Karawang Regency, Regency

- Indramayu, Cirebon Regency, Cianjur Regency, Ciamis Regency, Bogor Regency, Bekasi Regency, West Bandung Regency, Bandung Regency, Sumedang Regency, Subang Regency, and Garut Regency,
- c. Governor of Central Java and Regent / Mayor for wilayah Kabupaten / Kota with criteria:
- 1) level 2 (two) is Wonogiri Regency, Sukoharjo Regency, Sragen Regency, Tegal City, Surakarta City, Semarang City, Klaten Regency, Kendal Regency, Karanganyar Regency, Semarang Regency, Boyolali Regency, Demak Regency; and
 - 2) level 3 (three) is Wonosobo Regency, Temanggung Regency, Tegal Regency, Rembang Regency, Purworejo Regency, Purbalingga Regency, Pemalang Regency, Pati Regency, Magelang Regency, Kudus Regency, Salatiga City, Kota Pekalongan, Magelang City, Kebumen Regency, Cilacap Regency, Banyumas Regency, Banjarnegara Regency, Pekalongan Regency, Jepara Regency, Grobogan Regency, Brebes Regency, Blora Regency, and Batang Regency,
- d. Governor of Yogyakarta Special Region and Regent / Mayor for regency / city with criteria level 3 (three) namely Sleman Regency, Bantul Regency, Yogyakarta City, Kulonprogo Regency, and Gunungkidul Regency,
- e. Governor of East Java and Regent / Mayor for kabupaten / city region with criteria:
- 1) level 1 (one) is the city of Blitar;
 - 2) level 2 (two) namely Madiun City, Kediri City, Jombang Regency, Banyuwangi Regency, Pasuruan City; and
 - 3) level 3 (three) is Tulungagung Regency, Trenggalek Regency, Situbondo Regency, Sidoarjo Regency, Ponorogo Regency, Pacitan Regency, Ngawi Regency, Magetan Regency, Madiun Regency, Lumajang Regency, Surabaya City, Probolinggo City, Kota Mojokerto, Malang City, Batu City, Kediri Regency, Bondowoso Regency, Blitar Regency, Tuban Regency, Sumenep Regency, Sampang Regency, Probolinggo Regency, Pasuruan Regency, Pamekasan Regency, Nganjuk Regency, Kabupaten Mojokerto, Kabupaten Malang, Lamongan Regency, Jember Regency, Gresik Regency, Bojonegoro Regency, and Bangkalan Regency,

- f. Governor of Bali and Regent / Mayor for regency / city with criteria level 3 (three) namely Jembrana Regency, Bangli Regency, Karangasem Regency, Badung Regency, Gianyar Regency, Klungkung Regency, Tabanan Regency, Regency Buleleng, and Denpasar City.

SECOND

- : The determination of the level of the region as referred to in the Kesatu Dictum is guided by the Indicator of Adjustment of Public Health Efforts and Social Restrictions in the Response to the COVID-19 Pandemic set by the Minister of Health and added by the achievement of total vaccination dose 1 (one) and vaccination dose 1 (one) elderly over 60 (sixty) years from the vaccination target with the following provisions:
 - a. decreased district / city level from level 3 (three) to level 2 (two), with a total vaccination dose of 1 (one) at least 50% (fifty percent) and the achievement of vaccination dose 1 (one) elderly over 60 (sixty) years at least 40% (forty percent);
 - b. decreased district / city level from level 2 (two) to level 1 (one), with the achievement of total vaccination dose 1 (one) at least 70% (seventy percent) and the achievement of vaccination dose 1 (one) elderly over 60 (sixty) years at least by 60% (sixty percent); and
 - c. for regencies / cities that get exemptions in the Ministry of Home Affairs Number 43 of 2021 but the achievement of vaccination has not reached the target in the dictum both letter a and letter b, the level of the region rose to the level of 3 (three).

THIRD

- : Adjustments as referred to in the Second Dictum are also made to:
 - a. agglomeration areas in Jakarta, Bogor, Depok, Tangerang, Bekasi (Jabodetabek), Bandung Raya, Semarang Raya, Solo Raya, Yogyakarta Special Region, Surabaya Raya, Malang Raya, Magelang City and Magelang Regency, as well as Bali, where the assessment of the agglomeration areas is calculated as a unit and for the assessment of Indicators of Adjustment of Public Health Efforts and Social Restrictions in the Prevention of the COVID-19 Pandemic set by the Minister of Health and for achievement indicators on vaccination, assessment of the agglomeration area will follow the District / City with the lowest vaccination achievement; and
 - b. areas that are actively improving data,

FOURTH

- This is done in order to encourage the Regency / City to make improvements. data related to COVID-19.
- : PPKM in Regencies and Cities in Java and Bali with criteria Level 4 (four) as referred to in the KESATU Dictum is carried out by applying the following activities:
- a. the implementation of teaching and learning activities in the education unit is carried out through distance learning;
 - b. implementation of activities in the non-essential sector is enforced 100% (one hundred percent) *Work From Home* (WFH);
 - c. implementation of activities in the sector:
 - 1) essentials such as
 - a) finance and banking only include insurance, banks, pawnshops, futures exchanges, pension funds, and financing institutions (oriented to physical service with customers(*customers*));
 - b) capital market (which is oriented to service with customers (*customers*)and the running of capital market operations properly);
 - c) information and communication technology including mobile operators, data centers, internet, media related to the dissemination of information to the public;
 - d) hospitality non quarantine handling; and
 - e) industri export orientation and support where the company must show evidence of example of goods export notification (PEB) document for the last 12 (twelve) months or other documents showing export plans and must have an operational permit and mobility of industrial activities (IOMKI) with due regard to technical arrangements from the Ministry of Industry,can operate with the provisions of:
 - a) for letter a) can operate with a maximum capacity of 50% (fifty percent) of staff for locations related to service to the community, and 25% (twenty-five percent) for office administration services to support operations;
 - b) forthe letter b) up to the letter c) can operate with a maximum capacity of 50% (fifty percent) of staff;
 - c) for the letter d):
 - (1) must use the Care Protect application to screen all employees and visitors;

- (2) maximum capacity of 50% (fifty percent) and only visitors with green and yellow categories in the Care Protect application can enter;
 - (3) fitness center /*gym facilities*, meeting rooms /*meeting rooms* /*meetingrooms*, and meeting rooms with large capacity /*ballroom* temporarily closed; and
 - (4) Visitors under the age of 12 (twelve) years must show negative antigen (H-1)/PCR (H-2) results,
- d) for the letter e:
- (1) can only operate 1 (one) shift with a maximum capacity of 50% (fifty percent) staff only in production facilities / factories;
 - (2) 10% (ten percent) for office administration services to support operations;
 - (3) Numbers (1) (one) and numbers (2) (two) are carried out with strict implementation of health protocols; and
 - (4) must use the Peduli Lindungi application, entry and go home settings, and eat employees not at the same time,
- 2) essentials in the government sector follow the technical provisions issued by the Ministry of Utilization of State Apparatus and Bureaucratic Reform.
- 3) Critical such as:
- a) health;
 - b) security and order;
 - c) disaster management;
 - d) energy;
 - e) logistics, postal, transportation and distribution especially for the basic needs of the community;
 - f) food and drink and its support, including for livestock/ pets;
 - g) fertilizers and petrochemicals;
 - h) cement and building materials;
 - i) national vital objects;
 - j) national strategic project;
 - k) construction (public infrastructure including telecommunications and broadcasting infrastructure); and
 - l) basic utilities (electricity, water and waste management),
- can operate with the provisions of:
- a) for letter a) and letter b) can operate 100% (one hundred percent) of staff without exceptions;
 - b) for the letter c) up to the letter l) can operate 100% (one hundred percent)

maximum staff, only in production / construction facilities / services to the community and for office administration services to support operations, applied a maximum of 25% (twenty-five percent) of WFO staff;

- c) companies included in the sector in the letters d), e), f), g), h), k), and l) are obliged to use the Care Protect application to screen all employees and visitors who enter the production / construction / service facilities and office administration areas; and
 - d) companies that fall into the category of sectors according to letter c) wajib getrecommendations from the technical ministry of its sector builders before being able to gain access to use the Care Protect application,
- 4) for supermarkets, hypermarkets, traditional markets, grocery stores and supermarkets that sell daily necessities operating hours are limited to 21:00 local time with a visitor capacity of 50% (fifty percent);
 - 5) For supermarket and hypermarket must use the Care Protect application that has been started since September 14, 2021; and
 - 6) for pharmacies and drug stores can be open for 24 (twenty-four) hours,
- d. people's markets that sell non-daily goods can operate with a maximum capacity of 50% (fifty percent) and operating hours until 17:00 local time;
 - e. street vendors, grocery stores, voucher agents/*outlets*, *barbershops/ barbershops*, *laundry*, hawkers, small workshops, vehicle washes, and others of the same are allowed to open with strict health protocols until 21:00 local time and technical arrangements are carried out by the Local Government;
 - f. Eating/drinking in public places:
 - 1) food stalls / warteg, street vendors, hawkers, and the like are allowed to open with strict health protocols until 20:00 local time with a maximum of 3 (tiga) visitors and a maximum meal time of 30

- (Thirty) minutes. Subsequent technical arrangements are regulated by local governments;
- 2) restaurants / restaurants, cafes with locations located in closed buildings / shops both in separate locations and located in shopping centers / malls only accept *delivery / take away* and do not accept on-site dining(*dine-in*) whose technical regulations are determined by the Local Government; and
 - 3) restaurants / restaurants, cafes with service areas in open spaces are allowed to open with strict health protocols until 20:00 local time with a maximum capacity of 25% (twenty-five percent), one table maximum of 2 (two) people, and a maximum meal time of 30 (thirty) minutes whose technical arrangements are set by the Local Government,
- g. activities at pusat shopping / mall / trading center are temporarily closed except access for store employees who serve online sales with a maximum of 3 (three) people per store, restaurant, supermarket, and supermarket can be allowed with regard to the provisions of the dictum FOURTH letter c.4 and letter f.2;
 - h. the implementation of construction activities for public infrastructure (construction sites and project sites) operates 100% (one hundred percent) by applying health protocols more strictly;
 - i. places of worship (Mosques, Mosques, Churches, Temples, Monasteries, and Temples and other places that function as places of worship), with a maximum of 50% (fifty percent) capacity or 50 (fifty) people by applying health protocols more strictly and identifying technical arrangements of the Ministry of Religious Affairs;
 - j. public facilities (public areas, public parks, public tourist attractions and other public areas) are temporarily closed;
 - k. arts, cultural, sports and social activities (locations of art, culture, sports facilities and social activities that can cause crowds and crowds) are temporarily closed;
 - l. public transportation (public transportation, mass transit, taxis (conventional and *online*) and rental vehicles) are enforced with a maximum capacity setting of 50% (fifty percent) by applying health protocols more strictly;

- m. the implementation of the wedding reception was eliminated during the implementation of PPKM Level 4 (four);
- n. Domestic travelers using private cars, motorcycles and long-distance public transport (aircraft, buses, ships and trains) must:
 - 1) showing the vaccine card (minimum first dose vaccination);
 - 2) demonstrate PCR (H-2) for aircraft as well as Antigen (H-1) for modes of transportation of private cars, motorcycles, buses, trains and ships;
 - 3) the provisions referred to in number 1) and number 2) only apply to arrivals from outside Java and Bali or departures from Java and Bali out of Java and Bali, and do not apply to transportation in agglomeration areas as contoh for Jabodetabek region;
 - 4) for travel by aircraft between cities or regencies within Java Bali can show antigen negative results (H-1) on condition that they have obtained a second dose of vaccination, and a negative PCR (H-2) result if new to the vaccine dose1; and
 - 5) for drivers of logistics vehicles and other transportation of goods excluded from the provision of having a vaccine card,
- o. continue to wear the mask correctly and consistently when carrying out activities outside the home and is not allowed to use *face shield* without using a mask; and
- p. the implementation of PPKM at the RT / RW, Village / Village and Sub-District levels remains enforced by activating Posko-Posko at each level by looking at Zoning criteria for control of the territory.

FIFTH

- : PPKM in Regencies and Cities in Java and Bali with Criteria Level 3 (three) as referred to in the KESATU Dictum is carried out by applying the following activities:
 - a. the implementation of learning in the education unit can be done through limited face-to-face learning and/or distance learning based on the Joint Decree of the Minister of Education and Culture, Minister of Religious Affairs, Minister of Health and Minister of Home Affairs Number 03/KB/2021, Number 384 of 2021, Number HK.01.08/MENKES/4242/2021, Number 440-717 of 2021 on Guidance on The Implementation of Learning in the Coronavirus *Disease* Pandemic Period 2019 (COVID-19) and for education units that carry out limited face-to-face learning is implemented with a maximum capacity of 50% (five tens of percent), unless to:

- 1) SDLB, MILB, SMPLB, SMALB, and MALB maximum 62% (sixty-two percent) up to 100% (one hundred percent) by maintaining a distance of at least 1.5m (one five meter comma) and a maximum of 5 (five) learners per class; and
 - 2) MAXIMUM PAUD of 33% (thirty-three pern) by maintaining a distance of at least 1.5m (one five-metre coma) and a maximum of 5 (five) learners per class,
- b. the implementation of activities in the non-essential sector shall be applied 25% (twenty-five percent) of WFO for employees who have been vaccinated and must use the application of Care Protect at the entrance and exit of the workplace;
- c. implementation of activities in the sector:
- 1) essentials such as
 - a) finance and banking only include insurance, banks, pawnshops, futures exchanges, pension funds, and financing institutions (oriented to physical service with customers(*customers*));
 - b) capital market (which is service-oriented with customers(*customer*) and the running of capital market operations properly);
 - c) information and communication technology including mobile operators, data centers, internet, media related to the dissemination of information to the public;
 - d) hospitality non quarantine handling; and
 - e) export orientation and supporting industry where the company must show proof of example of goods export notification (PEB) document for the last 12 (twelve) months or other documents showing export rencana and must have IOMKI with due regard to technical arrangements of the Ministry of Industry,can operate with the provisions of:
 - a) for the letter a) can operate with a maximum capacity of 50% (fifty percent) of staff for locations with service to the community, and 25% (twenty-five percent) for office administration services to support operations;
 - b) for the letter b) up to the letter c) can operate with a maximum capacity of 50% (fifty percent) of staff;
 - c) for the letter d):
 - (1) must use the Care Protect application to screen all employees and visitors;
 - (2) maximum capacity of 50% (fifty percent) and only visitors with green and yellow categories in the Care Protect application are bby entering;

- (3) fitness center /*gym facilities*, meeting rooms / meeting rooms /meeting rooms, and meeting rooms with large capacity /*ballroom* are allowed to open using the Application Care Protect and maximum capacity 50% (fifty percent),as well as the provision of food and beverage in meeting room facilities / meeting rooms /*meetingrooms* , and meeting rooms with large capacity /*ballroom* are presented in box and no buffet dishes; and
 - (4) Visitors under the age of 12 (twelve) must show results antigen negative (H-1)/PCR (H-2),
- d) for the letter e:
- (1) can only operate with shift arrangements with a maximum capacity of 50% (fifty percent) of staff for each shift only in production facilities / factories;
 - (2) 10% (ten percent) for office administration services to support operations;
 - (3) numbers (1) (one) and numbers (2) (two) are performed by implementing health protocols;
 - (4) use the Care Protect app for incoming and home settings; and
 - (5) Eating employees not at the same time,
- 2) essentials in the government sector follow the technical provisions issuedby the Ministry of Utilization of State Apparatus and BureaucraticReform.
- 3) Critical such as:
- a) health;
 - b) security and order;
 - c) disaster management;
 - d) energy;
 - e) logistics, postal, transportation and distribution especially for the basic needs of the community;
 - f) food and drink and its support, including for livestock/ pets;
 - g) fertilizers and petrochemicals;
 - h) cement and building materials;
 - i) national vital objects;
 - j) national strategic projects;
 - k) construction (public infrastructure including telecommunications and broadcasting infrastructure);
 - l) basic utilities (electricity, water and waste management),

can operate with the provisions of:

- a) for letter a) and letter b) can operate 100% (one hundred percent) of staff without exceptions;
 - b) for the letter c) up to the letter l) can operate 100% (one hundred percent) maximum staff, only in production / construction / service facilities to the community and for office administration services to support operations, applied a maximum of 25% (twenty-five percent) percent of staff;
 - c) companies included in the sector in the letters d), e), f), g), h), k), and l) are obliged to use the Care Protect application to screen all employees and visitors who enter the production / construction / service facilities and office administration areas; and
 - d) companies that fall into the category of sectors according to letter c must get a recommendation from the technical ministry of its sector builder before it can gain access to use the Care Protect application,
- 4) for supermarkets, hypermarkets, traditional markets, grocery stores and supermarkets that sell daily necessities are limited to operating hours until 21:00 local time with a visitor capacity of 50% (fifty percent);
 - 5) For supermarkets and hypermarkets must use the Care Protect application which has been started since September 14, 2021; and
 - 6) for pharmacies and drug stores can be open for 24 (twenty-four) hours,
- d. people's markets that sell non-daily goods can operate with a maximum capacity of 50% (fifty percent) and operating hours until 17:00 local time;
 - e. street vendors, grocery stores, voucher agents/*outlets*, *barbershops/ barbershops*, *laundry*, hawkers, small workshops, vehicle washes, and others of the same are allowed to open by applying strict health protocols until 21:00 local time whose technical arrangements are carried out by the Local Government;
 - f. Eating/drinking in public places:

- 1) food stalls / warteg, street vendors, hawkers and the like are allowed to open with strict health protocols until 21:00 local time with a maximum of 50% (fifty percent) of the capacity and meal time of 60 (sixty) minutes;
 - 2) Restaurants / restaurants, cafes with locations located in buildings / shops or open areas both in separate locations and located in shopping centers / malls are allowed to open with the following provisions:
 - a) with strict health protocols until 21:00 local time;
 - b) with a maximum capacity of 50% (fifty percent);
 - c) one table maximum of 2 (two) people;
 - d) maximum meal time of 60 (sixty) minutes;
 - e) must use the Care Protect application to screen all visitors and employees,
 - 3) restaurants/ restaurants, cafes with operating hours starting from night can operate under the following conditions:
 - a) with strict health protocols and operating hours of 18:00 to a maximum of 00:00 local time;
 - b) with a maximum capacity of 25% (twenty-five percent);
 - c) one table maximum of 2 (two) people;
 - d) maximum meal time of 60 (sixty) minutes; and
 - e) must use the Care Protect application to screen all visitors and employees,
 - 4) technical arrangement of numbers 1) up to number 3) regulated by the Local Government,
- g. activities in shopping centers / malls / trading centers are opened with the provisions:
- 1) maximum capacity of 50% (fifty percent) and operating hours up to 10:00 p.m. 21.00 local time with due regard to the provisions in letter c.4) and letter f.2) and carried out by the implementation of health protocols regulated by the Ministry of Trade;
 - 2) must use the Care Protect application to conduct screening for all visitors and employees of shopping centers / malls / related trade centers;
 - 3) Residents under the age of 12 (twelve) years are prohibited from entering shopping centers / malls / trading centers, except in DKI Jakarta Province, Kota

Tangerang, Tangerang Regency, South Tangerang City, Bogor City, Bekasi City, Depok City, Bogor Regency, Bekasi Regency, Bandung City, Yogyakarta City, Surabaya City with conditions accompanied by parents;

4) children's playgrounds, and entertainment venues in shopping malls/ malls/ trading centers are closed;

5) Cinemas can operate on the grounds

As follows:

- a) must use the Care Protect application to screen all visitors and employees;
 - b) maximum capacity of 50% (fifty percent) and only visitors with green and yellow categories in the Care Protect application can enter;
 - c) visitors under the age of 12 (twelve) are prohibited from entering;
 - d) restaurants/restaurants and cafes within the bioskop area are allowed to accept on-site dining (dine in) with a maximum capacity of 50% (fifty percent) and a maximum meal time of 60 (sixty) minutes; and
 - e) following health protocols regulated by the Ministry of Tourism and Creative Economy and the Ministry of Health,
- h. the implementation of construction activities for public infrastructure (construction sites and project sites) operates 100% (one hundred percent) and non-construction of public infrastructure is allowed a maximum of 30 (thirty) people by applying health protocols more strictly;
- i. places of worship (Mosques, Mosques, Churches, Temples, Monasteries, and Temples and other places that function as places of worship), can hold congregational worship activities during the implementation of PPKM Level 3 (three) with a maximum of 50% (fifty percent) capacity or 50 (fifty) people by applying health protocols more strictly with regard to technical provisions of the Ministry of Religious Affairs;
- j. public facilities (public areas, public parks, public tourist attractions and other public areas) are temporarily closed;
- k. there will be a trial of health protocols for certain tourist attractions with the provisions
- As follows:

- 1) follow the protocol regulated by the Ministry of Tourism and Creative Economy, and the Ministry of Health;
 - 2) must use the Care Protect application to screen all visitors and employees;
 - 3) children under 12 (twelve) years old are prohibited from entering tourist attractions conducted by this trial;
 - 4) the list of tourist attractions that will take the cob test is determined by the Ministry of Tourism and Creative Economy; and
 - 5) odd - even application along the road to and from the location of tourist attractions from Friday at 12:00 to Sunday at 18:00 local time,
- I. Arts, cultural, sporting and social activities (locations of arts, culture, sports facilities and social activities that may cause crowds and crowds) are temporarily closed, except for:
- 1) Sports activities are conducted in open spaces (*outdoor*) either individually or small groups of a maximum of 4 (four) people, do not involve physical contact with others and do not routinely require individual interaction in close proximity can be implemented with the implementation of strict health protocols. Sports activities in enclosed spaces, sports activities conducted in groups, and sports matches are temporarily closed;
 - 2) sports facilities in open spaces are allowed to be opened with a number of people 50% (fifty percent) of maximum capacity;
 - 3) there will be a trial of health protocols for fitness center / gym facilities with the following provisions;
 - a) facilities are located in the province of DKI Jakarta, Tangerang City, Tangerang Regency, South Tangerang City, Bogor City, Bekasi City, Depok City, Bogor Regency, Bekasi Regency, Bandung City, Cimahi City, West Bandung Regency, Bandung Regency, Sumedang Regency, Semarang City, Kendal Regency, Semarang Regency, Demak Regency, Sidoarjo Regency, Surabaya City, Mojokerto City, Kabupaten Mojokerto, Lamongan Regency, Gr Regency esik, and Bangkalan Regency;
 - b) 25% (twenty-five%) of maximum capacity;
 - c) must follow health protocols regulated by the Ministry of Health; and
 - d) must use the Care Protect application to screen all visitors and employees,

- 4) Masks should be used during olahraga activities, except for sports activities that must remove the mask, such as swimming. For sports activities that must remove the mask, the mask is only removed when the implementation of sports activities;

 - c) companies included in the sectors of d), e), f), g), h), k), and l) are required to use the Care Protect application that has been started from the date September 7, 2021 to conduct screening of all employees and visitors who enter the production / construction / service facilities and office administration areas; and
 - d) companies included in the sector category in accordance with letter c) must get recommendations from the technical ministry of its sector builders before they can gain access to use the Care Protect application,

Places of worship (Mosques, Mosques, Churches, Temples, Monasteries, and Temples and other places that function as places of worship), can hold congregational religious activities during the implementation of PPKM Level 1 (one) with a maximum of 75% (seventy-five percent) capacity or 100 (one hundred) people by applying health protocols more strictly and paying attention to the provisions of the technical from the Ministry of Agama;
- j. public facilities (public areas, public parks, public tourist attractions and other public areas) are allowed to open with a maximum capacity of 75% (seventy-five percent) by applying health protocols more strictly and must use the Care Protect application;
- k. Arts, cultural, sports and social activities (art locations, culture, sports facilities and social activities that can cause crowds and crowds) are allowed to open with a maximum capacity of 75% (seventy-five percent) by applying to health protocols more strictly and must use the Care Protect application;
- l. public transportation (public transportation, mass transit, taxis (conventional and *online*) and rental vehicles) are enforced with a maximum capacity setting of 100% (one hundred percent) by applying health protocols more strictly;

EIGHTH

- : Industries that have export and domestic orientation in the region of level 4 (four), level 3 (three), and level 2 (two) are allowed to operate with a capacity of 100% (one hundred percent) of staff divided into at least 2 (two) *shifts* with the following provisions:
- a. I have IOMKI and get the recommendation of the Ministry of Industry;
 - b. the company and its employees are obliged to use a protecting application to screen people in and out of the company's production facilities;
 - c. at least 50% (fifty percent) of employees have been vaccinated dose 1 (one);
 - d. all companies must follow the reference of health protocols determined by the Ministry of Industry and the Ministry of Health; and
 - e. Ministry of Industry and local government in order to be able to do supervision of the implementation of this protocol.

NINTH

- : League 1 Football Competition (one) can be held a maximum of 9 (nine) matches and League 2 Football Competition (two) can be held a maximum of 8 (eight) matches each week, with the provision as next:

- 1) tempat implementation only in the district / city with criteria level 3 (three) and level 2 (two);
- 2) all players, officials, media crews, and support staff are required to use the protecting application to screen people in and out of competitions and training;
- 3) The competition is not allowed to accept live viewing in the stadium. Activities to watch together by supporters are also not allowed;
- 4) all players, officials, media crews, and support staff present in the competition must have obtained a second dose of vaccination, negative results of PCR H-1 and antigen negative results on the day of the match; and
- 5) the implementation of league 1 (one) competition must follow the rules of health protocol determined by the Ministry of Health and Football Association throughout Indonesia.

TENTH

- : Development Basketball League (DBL) competitions can be held in Jakarta and Surabaya, with the following conditions:
- 1) all players, officials, media crews, and support staff are required to use the protecting application to screen people in and out of competitions and training;
 - 2) The competition is not allowed to receive a live audience in the stadium. Activities to watch together by supporters are also not allowed;
 - 3) all players, officials, media crews, and support staff present in the competition must have obtained the second dose of vaccine and negative PCR H-2 results; and
 - 4) The implementation of the competition must follow the rules health protocols prescribed by the Ministry of Health.

ELEVENTH

- : Restrictions on the entrance of international passenger travel are governed by the following conditions:
- a) The air entrance is only through Soekarno Hatta Airport and Sam Ratulangi. Bali's Ngurah Rai Airport will open on 120 December.
October 14, 2021 as long as it meets the requirements and requirements regarding quarantine, test, and readiness of the task force.
 - b) sea entrance only through the ports of Batam, Tanjung Pinang, and Nunukan;
 - c) land entrance only through Aruk and Entikong Cross-Border Post (PLBN), and Motaain; and

- d) technical arrangements related to the implementation of the provisions referred to in letter a) up to letter c) and in the transition period will be further regulated by the Ministry of Transportation.
- TWELVE : The Governor after getting the vaccine supply from the Ministry of Health, immediately distributes to the Regency / City and is not detained as a reserve (stock) in the Province.
- THIRTEENTH : Governors, Regents and Mayors prohibit any form of activity that can be Causing a crowd.
- FOURTEENTH : Governors, Regents and Mayors coordinate and in collaboration with TNI, Polri and prosecutor in the implementation of PPKM.
- FIFTEENTH : Implementing the tightening of activities and education with the following principles:
- a. COVID-19 is most contagious in closed conditions, long meeting meetings (more than 15 (fifteen) minutes), close interaction, crowds, activities with strong breathing noodlessing, talking and laughing and not wearing masks as when eating together;
 - b. Proper and consistent use of masks is the minimum health protocol that everyone should implement;
 - c. washing hands with soap or *hand sanitizer* repeatedly especially after touching objects touched by others (such as doorknobs or ladder handles), touching the face area with the hands needs to be avoided;
 - d. A good type of mask will be more protective with the use of a mask as many as 2 (two) layers is a good choice. The mask should be replaced after use (>4 (more than four) hours);
 - e. the application of health protocols is carried out by considering air ventilation factors, duration, and distance of interaction, to minimize the risk of transmission in activities;
 - f. Distance considerations can be applied as follows:
 - 1) activities from home only, and interact only with people who live at home;
 - 2) If you have to leave the house, then you should always try to distance at least 2 (two) meters in interacting with others. Reduce/avoid contact with others who do not live at home; and
 - 3) socializing various visual clues in general regarding the prevention and handling of COVID-19,

- g. Duration considerations can be applied as follows:
 - 1) if you have to interact with others or attend an activity, done for a short duration to reduce the risk of transmission; and
 - 2) in offices and other activity situations, scheduling and rotation can help to reduce the duration of interaction,
- h. Ventilation considerations can be applied as follows:
 - 1) Outdoor activities have a much lower risk of transmission than indoors; and
 - 2) The room should always be strived to have good airventilation. Opening doors, windows can be done to reduce the risk of transmission. In the condition that the door or window cannot be opened, then the *air purifier* with *High Efficiency Particulate Air* (HEPA) filter can be used indoors,
- i. in the conditions of penularan already widespread in the community, then stricter interventions by limiting the mobility of the community significantly need to be done;
- j. 3T strengthening(*testing, tracing, treatment*)needs to continue to be applied:
 - 1) *Testing* needs to be improved according to the weekly *positivity rate*, with the following conditions:

<i>Positivity rate</i>	Number of tests (per 1000 inhabitants per week)
<5%	1
>5%-<15%	5
>15%-<25%	10
>25%	15

Testing needs to be continuously improved with a target *positivity rate* of <5% (five percent). Daily *testing* target is the minimum number of daily tests that must be met by districts / cities. The person who is counted into the target *test* is the suspect and contact of the confirmation case, not the asymptomatic person being screened. The target number of tests must be achieved at the district / city level following the following table:

- 2) *Tracing* needs to be done until it reaches more than 15 close contacts per confirmed case. Quarantine needs to be done on those identified as close contacts. Once identified close contact should be checked immediately (*entry-test*) and quarantine needs to be run. If the test results are positive, isolation is necessary. If the test result is negative then it is necessary to continue quarantine. On the 5th day of quarantine it is necessary to re-examine (*exit-test*) to see if the virus is detected after / during the incubation period. If it is negative then the patient is considered finished quarantine; and
- 3) *Treatment* needs to be done with comprehensive according to the severity of the symptoms. Only moderately severe and critically symptomatic patients need to be treated at home. Isolation needs to be strictly done to prevent transmission,

Accelerated vaccination efforts must continue to protect as many people as possible and these efforts are being made to reduce the rate of transmission and put the safety of those who are dying (such as elderly people with comorbidities) given the limited health capacity and long-term impact of COVID-19 infection.

SIXTEENTH

- : Governors and Mayors to:
- a. accelerate the process of distributing social assistance and social safety nets sourced from APBD if there is an additional need for funding for budgeting and distribution of social assistance and social safety net in support of the implementation of PPKM COVID-19 then:
 - 1) rationalization and/or budget reallocation of programs/activities that lack priority in the social assistance budget and social safety net;
 - 2) rationalization and/or reallocation of additional funding needs for budgeting and distribution of social assistance / social security net in support of the implementation of PPKM COVID-19 guided by Article 4 and Article 5 of The Minister of Home Affairs Regulation No. 20 of 2020 on Accelerating the Handling of Corona Virus Disease 20 19 in the Local Government Environment and Article 3 to Article 6 of the Regulation of the Minister of Home Affairs Number 39 of 2020 on The Utilization of Corona Virus Disease 20 19 in the Local Government Environment and Article 3 to Article 6 of the Regulation of the Minister of Home Affairs Number 39 of 2020 on The Utilization of Corona Virus Disease 20 19 in the Local Government Environment and Article 3 to Article 6 of the Minister of Home Affairs Regulation No. 39 of 2020 on The Acceleration of The Handling of Corona Virus Disease 20 19 in the Local Government Environment and Article 3 to Article 6 of the Regulation of the Minister of Home Affairs Number 39 of 2020 on The Utilization of Corona Virus Disease 20 19 in the Local Government Environment and Article 3 to Article 6 of the Regulation of the Minister of Home Affairs No. 39 of 2020 on The Utilization of *Corona Virus Disease* 2019 in the Local Government Environment and Article 3 to Article 6 of the Regulation of the Use of Budget Allocation for Certain Activities Changes allocation and Use of Regional Revenue and Spending Budgets;
 - 3) on the acceleration of the distribution and implementation of BLT-Dana Desa (BLT-DD):
 - a) Regent / Mayor to accelerate the evaluation of APBDesa for Villages that have not established village regulations regarding APBDesa endorsement of KPM data by the Regional government recordern KPM data of BLT-DD recipients on Om-SPAN in accordance withthe provisions of the laws and regulations; and
 - b) Village Head to conduct data collection and determination of KPM and follow up with the implementation of BLT-DD in accordance with the provisions of the laws and regulationssynchronize social assistance originating from the center with social assistance
Sourced from APBD.

- SEVENTEENTH : Funding for the Implementation of PPKM due to the COVID-19 Pandemic sourced from APBD:
- a. in the implementation of PPKM due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, local governments can make expenditures that are not yet available budget which is further proposed in the draft regulation of APBD;
 - b. expenses as referred to by letter a are carried out by direct loading on Unexpected Shopping (BTT);
 - c. in the event that BTT is insufficient, the Local Government reschedules the achievements of programs and activities to first use the allocation of certain activity budgets and / or changes in budget allocation and utilize the cash available through changes to regional head regulations on APBD and notify the leadership of the Regional People's Representative Council. The results of the budget allocation rescheduling the achievements of the program and activities in question are diverted for unexpected spending; and
 - d. procedures for the use of BTT in the framework of the implementation of PPKM due to the COVID-19 Pandemic sourced from APBD based on the Regulation of the Minister of Home Affairs No. 39 In 2020.

- EIGHTEENTH : a. In the event that the Governor of the Regent and the Mayor do not implement the provisions referred to in the Instruction of the Minister is subject to sanctions as stipulated in Article 68 to Article 78 of Law No. 23 of 2014 on Local Government;
- b. For Public Transportation Shopping Center Restaurant Business Actors as referred to in dictum III letter c letter d letter e and letter j that do not implement the provisions as stipulated in this Instruction are subject to administrative sanctions until the closing of the business in accordance with the provisions of the laws and regulations; and
 - c. Any person may be sanctioned for those who commit violations in order to control infectious disease outbreaks based on:
 - 1) The Criminal Code Article 212 to Article 218;
 - 2) Law No. 4 of 1984 on Infectious Disease Outbreaks;
 - 3) Law No. 6 of 2018 on Health Quarantine; and
 - 4) Regional Regulations of Regional Head Regulations; and
 - 5) Other relevant laws and regulations.

NINETEENTH : This Ministerial Instruction comes into effect on the date
October 5, 2021 to October
18, 2021.


